



Forum Results incorporated in the action plans of the ANECD and the National Networks for Early Childhood





The first Regional ECD Forum organised by ANECD under the title “Caring for Young Children in a Turbulent World: Development Strategies in Arab Countries,” from September 8 to 10, 2023, hosted several sessions where a wide range of early childhood issues in Arab countries was addressed, with the participation of various sectors, including governmental agencies, non-governmental organisations, and academicians.

The sessions’ discussions contributed to the identification of recommendations that enrich the strategy of the Arab Network for Early Childhood. These recommendations will also contribute to defining and tuning the agendas of the national ECD networks, in addition to identifying potential action points between the Arab network and the national networks, which enhances the opportunity for collaborative initiatives to advance early childhood development in the region.

Concerning ECD in Emergencies and Crisis	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Adapting international indicators and methodologies such as the Nurturing Care Framework to suit each country. ● Establishing coordination structures to be an interface between the different sectors contributing to identifying needs and effectively directing efforts through national ECD networks. ● Holding periodic meetings and national workshops to exchange information and determine priorities. ● Setting priorities by identifying the areas most in need of support in the context of crises at the national level. ● Supporting advocacy and communication activities through platforms and websites.
Concerning ECD and Climate Change and Environmental Hazards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Participate in specialised research on the climate change crisis to produce tools and recommendations. ● Raising awareness about the effects of climate degradation on early childhood. ● Encourage the development of environmentally friendly infrastructure for childcare and education institutions. ● Propose minimum standards for planning projects that are both environmentally friendly and child friendly. ● Encouraging environmental and civic education integration into the curricula according to each country's context. ● Setting priorities by identifying the areas most in need of support in the context of climate crises at the national level.
Concerning the Early Childhood Workforce	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Participate in specialised research to study the reality of the early childhood workforce. ● Launching awareness and marketing campaigns that restore consideration to the value and actual importance of the ECW, professionalising the sector, and creating enabling environments, including decent working conditions. ● Developing an advocacy plan to remove social stigma from the ECW workers. ● Setting priorities by identifying the areas most in need of support in the context of ECW issues at the national level. ● Providing training, building on capacities, and creating a space for exchanging experiences for the ECW. ● Providing professional guidance, mentoring, and counselling programs for students and trainees in early childhood. ● Advocating for strategies to attract and retain workers through awareness campaigns, raising wages, improving working conditions, building on capacities, and training opportunities. ● Design flexible programs and make courses available online to enable access from anywhere.

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Concerning Child Rights	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Providing awareness and education programs for the community on child rights and their importance and focusing on changing practices that may threaten those rights. ● Training professionals on child rights, including judges, lawyers, teachers and care workers. ● Promoting community participation in decision-making processes related to child rights. ● Involving NGOs and community networks in program design, implementation, and monitoring. ● Strengthening partnerships between the public, non-governmental, and private sectors, providing opportunities for collaborative participation in designing and implementing policies, and providing effective communication between governmental, non-governmental, and academic organisations. ● Organizing campaigns and events to raise awareness on child rights topics in societies and using the media and social media to spread awareness effectively. ● Establish coordination structures that bring together representatives from all the relevant sectors at the national level. ● Contributing and advocating for developing a comprehensive and holistic approach to providing early childhood services that include health, education, and social dimensions. ● Setting priorities by identifying the areas most in need of support in the context of child rights at the national level.
Concerning Digital Empowerment and Cyber security and safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Launching awareness campaigns to enhance digital education by promoting a better understanding of the dangers of the Internet for children and educating children and parents on safe behaviours. ● Contributing to promoting tools and techniques that allow parents and caregivers to monitor and protect children from inappropriate content. ● Create and activate mechanisms for reporting harmful content or digital harassment. ● Contributing to developing laws that protect children from online harassment and exploitation. ● Contribute to periodically reviewing and updating digital policies to keep pace with technological developments and new challenges. ● Develop programs to provide psychological and legal support to children who are victims of digital threats.

Concerning ECD in Emergencies and Crisis	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Providing educational resources and advice on holistic care for parents and caregivers. ● Providing training courses for teachers and parents to build on their skills and effectively use education and care resources through appropriate tools. ● Providing remote education programs for children and teachers in the event of inability to reach schools directly. ● Providing online health counselling services to families to meet basic healthcare needs, including mental health and psychosocial support. ● Providing financial and in-kind assistance to affected families through appropriate tools according to the context of the crisis. ● Create safe and supportive social platforms that enhance communication and engage parents and teachers to exchange experiences and support.
Concerning ECD and Climate Change and Environmental Hazards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Contributing to developing environmental education programs. ● Raising community awareness and using leading role models to influence the values of sustainability and social responsibility, whether through stories or visiting lecturers with experience in sustainability. ● Including environmental and civic education in early childhood development curricula and developing children’s endurance and adaptation skills by organising educational activities. ● Provide opportunities for children to learn about and participate in local sustainable initiatives.
Concerning the Early Childhood Workforce	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Establishing practical training programs that unite educational institutions, non-governmental organisations, and local communities. ● Providing opportunities for trainees to work with children in real environments under qualified supervision, including working with children with learning difficulties and disabilities. ● Cooperating to improve and develop curricula for various educational programs in early childhood. ● Include training curricula that reflect the latest research and best practices. ● Integrating practical and experimental elements into curricula to prepare students for actual field work. ● Providing platforms for interaction and exchange among the workforce to stimulate innovation and participation in work experiences. ● Employing technology to improve employees’ access to educational resources, training, and exchange of experiences. ● Contribute to developing a tool for continuous assessment of ECW needs.

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<p>Concerning Child Rights</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Contribute to the development of educational programs that reflect children's local identity and culture and encourage understanding and respect for cultural differences. ● Cooperating with community institutions and organisations to provide parents with comprehensive, holistic educational programs and enhance communication. ● Providing resources and opportunities for the community to participate in program development. ● Build on the capacities of teachers and staff by providing training on cultural diversity and effective interaction with families. ● Contribute to developing a tool for continuous evaluation and feedback from families and the community about programs and laws.
